Our agency is comprised of over 2,400 individuals working collectively and in partnership with community based organizations to serve the needs of the community.








Child Welfare






CalWORKs

The California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) Program provides time-limited cash aid, employment and employment support services to eligible adults with children.




Program by Age and Gender





Individual by Type



General Assistance (GA) provides cash aid to indigent adults and emancipated minors who are legal residents of Alameda County and who have no other means of support.





Adult Protection







IHSS provides homecare for the elderly and persons with disabilities to support them in their own homes and communities, rather than placing them in more restrictive and expensive institutional care settings.






Area Agency on Aging

Definitions and Terms

CalWORKs

Two Parent Families - Families with children living in the home with two non-disabled, natural or adoptive parents

Non-Needy Caretaker - Families with children living in the home whose natural or adoptive parents are ineligible or excluded from receiving assistance.

TANF Timed-Out - Families with children living in the home whose parents are ineligible for receiving assistance because an adult head-of-household or spouse of a head-of-household has received Federal TANF assistance for a total of 60 cumulative months

Child Only -Families with children living in the home whose parents are ineligible for receiving assistance

Total clients in Welfare to Work- All active CalWORKs adults who have been registered into the Welfare to Work (WTW) program. WTW is the mandatory employment and training program for CalWORKs adults. Clients must register for WTW unless exempted for a condition that prevents them from working. All registered WTW clients are not actively engaged in the program, as they may be scheduled for activities that have not yet begun, between activities, or non-compliant prior to sanction.

Supported work & community experience - Includes public or private sector employment, under the close supervision of the activity provider, that helps provide basic job skills, and can help lead to eventual unsubsidized employment.

Paying jobs - Includes unsubsidized and subsidized public, private sector and self-employment.

<u>CalFresh</u>

Non Assistance CalFresh – Client receives CalFresh assistance only Public Assistance CalFresh – Client receives CalFresh in addition to other county assistance (e.g. CalWORKs)

Child Welfare Placement Definitions

THP+FC - Transitional Housing Program for Non-Minor Dependents in extended foster care

SILP - Supervised Independent Living Placement

Guardian Home - Placement with court appointed legal guardian

Relative/NREFM - Relative / Non Relative Extended Family Member

Group Home - 24-Hour staffed residential and/or treatment facility for foster youth

Foster Family Agency – An agency that provides foster homes through a network of providers they supervise; licensed through Community Care Licensing

Foster Family Home - County sponsored foster care home
