Announcements and Updates for the Alameda County Commission on Aging – April 10, 2023

SB 37 (Caballero), the Older Adults and Adults with Disabilities Housing Stability Act, will create a targeted housing stabilization program that will prevent and solve homelessness for many thousands of older adults and people living with disabilities. The bill passed the Senate Housing Committee in March and is headed to the Senate Human Services Committee on April 24.

AB 1313 (Ortega), will create a 3-year pilot in Alameda, Marin, and Sonoma Counties to demonstrate the value of case management services for older adults who are not eligible for Medi-Cal. The pilot would build upon the Case Management program that is funded by Older Americans Act, increasing the number of people served and building a solid case for continuing state funding. This bill is jointly sponsored by Alameda County Social Services Agency and Senior Services Coalition. AB 1313 is being heard in the Assembly Aging and Long-Term Care Committee on Tuesday, April 25, 2023.

AB 922 (Wicks), establishes the Prepared Meals Delivery Program and requires Alameda County to participate. The program would deliver prepared meals to people living in unhoused encampments and provide information on enrollment in CalFresh. The bill would appropriate funding to cover the program for three years.
