



CEDAW Implementation


Gender-Based Analysis and Action Plan

- Task force or consultant working with representatives from all departments
- Evaluation of gender equity in department operations, employment practices, contracting, budget allocations, delivery of direct and indirect services
- Action plan consistent with intent, purpose, and requirements of CEDAW, composed of specific recommendations on how departments will correct any identified areas for improvement, with annual reports to a governing body on meeting specified goals



County of Alameda CEDAW Related Activities: SSA - HCSA - HR - Probation


Economic Development - Basic Needs - Education - Housing & Homelessness



SSA Sun Center for Opportunity provides a construction pre-apprenticeship training program to a women-only cohort every year

HCSA Queens of Castle provided programming for incoming 11th & 12th grade African American girls at Castlemont High School with the goal of connecting participating students with a group of peers and adults to support them during the upcoming school year and beyond


Gender-Based Violence – Protective Services – Criminal Justice System



SSA Root to Bloom - Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children and Youth (CSEC/Y) Workgroup in Children & Family Services coordinates services and resources to exploited and at-risk children and youth, agency workers, and community and family partners

Alameda County Probation Department has a model policy on Transgender and Intersex Youth that has been shared nationwide

Healthcare – Reproductive Health



HCSA Black Women's Media and Wellness Project has operated in Alameda County for over 20 years, serving the needs of African American women in addressing co-occurring conditions and environmental risk factors

SSA Making Proud Choices, available to youth aged 14-18 receiving services from Children & Family Services, promotes sexual health, healthy relationships, and teaches how to prevent unplanned pregnancies & how to reduce the risk of HIV and STIs

Social Services Agency Staff Resources:

- Administrative Specialist II
 - Average of 36 hours a month
 - Responsibilities: Serve as liaison between Commission and Agency: scheduling, booking rooms, ordering supplies & refreshments, calendaring, coordinating with CAO in posting agendas & meeting minutes, updating website with meeting announcements, participating in Regular Meetings and special events, coordinating communication with Board offices
- Director of Public Affairs
 - Average of 15 hours per month
 - Responsibilities: Participating in Regular Meetings as necessary, administrative assistance
- Management Analyst
 - Range of 10 35 hours a month
 - Responsibilities: Preparing for and participating in Policy & Advocacy Subcommittee and Regular Meetings, research and policy analysis on Commission goals, advising on and developing PAL requests for recommended legislation
