

# Pandemic Public Benefits Available to Alameda County Residents



# Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary Payment (SSI/SSP)

**Eligibility**: SSI is a federal program available to low income individuals age 65 and older or blind or disabled. SSP is a state program that augments SSI. Both SSI and SSP are administered by the Social Security Administration (SSA). **Details**: Must meet income and asset limits. 2021 grant levels for individuals are \$955 for individuals and \$1,598 for couples.

## Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI)

**Eligibility**: CAPI is a 100% state funded program to those ineligible for SSI/SSP solely due to their immigration status. CAPI is administered through ACSSA.

**Details**: CAPI payments are equivalent to those provided through SSI/SSP.

## CalFresh & Enhanced CalFresh

**Eligibility**: Must be eligible for CalFresh.

**Details**: All households receive the maximum amount of monthly CalFresh benefits for their household size, regardless of income and expenses. Benefits available through regular County/ACSSA eligibility and redetermination processes.

## Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT) 2.0

**Eligibility**: Children age 0-6 years old that are part of a household receiving CalFresh food benefits. School age children eligible for free or reduced-price meals having attended school via distance learning or hybrid distance and in-person learning during 2020-2021 school year.

**Details**: Maximum benefit \$123 per month per child. There is no application for P-EBT 2.0, which will be automatically mailed July - August 2021 for children under age 6 and August - November 2021 for school aged children.

## Women, Infant & Children Program (WIC)

**Eligibility**: WIC is available to pregnant or breastfeeding women, infants, and young children if the applicant has an annual income at or below 185% Federal Poverty Level (currently \$48,470 for a family of four). Those who recently lost their jobs or are unable to work due to COVID-19 may be eligible.

**Details**: Health & nutrition program for women and children under the age of 5, apply through public health department.

#### Local Emergency Food Distribution

**Eligibility**: An individual or family experiencing food insecurity or in need of emergency food or meal delivery services.

**Details**: Call 2-1-1 or utilize the Alameda County COVID-19 Food Distribution, Testing, and Services map to locate food distribution sites near you.

## Child Care Resource & Referral Agencies

Referral Details: Families who live in Alameda, Albany, Berkeley, Emeryville, Oakland, or Piedmont can call 510-658-0381 or email referrals@bananasbunch.org. **Eligibility**: Renters who meet income requirements and require assistance for unpaid and future rent and utilities due to COVID-19. Applicants may qualify regardless of immigration status, and landlords may apply.

**Details**: Up to 100% of rental and utility arrears may be paid off through the program.

## Season of Sharing Program (SOS)

Eligibility: Alameda County residents with dependent children or who are disabled, aged 55 or older, former foster youth, veterans, survivors of intimate partner violence and violent crimes, and pregnant people.

Details: One-time assistance to people experiencing a housing crisis that can be resolved through one-time assistance. Call the pre-screening line at 510-272-3700.

## Housing & Emergency Lodging Program (HELP)

**Eligibility**: Single adult individuals living in Alameda County who do not meet SOS eligibility criteria, and are homeless or at-risk of homelessness, and have sustainable income. **Details**: HELP will provide one-time crisis-based financial assistance for critical housing needs. #### Emergency Broadband Benefit

**Eligibility**: Individuals with disabilities and others in lowincome households (including those receiving CalFresh or Medi-Cal)

**Details**: Provides up to \$50/month to help cover the cost of internet access & a stipend of up to \$100 toward qualifying laptops, tablets, or computers.

#### COVID-19 Funeral Assistance

**Eligibility**: Funeral expenses for those deceased due to COVID-19 after 1/20/20, no citizenship requirement for deceased though applicant must be a U.S citizen, noncitizen national, or qualified alien.

#### **Federal Tax Credits**



## Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC)

**Eligibility**: Filed a 2020 tax return (available each tax year), income below certain limits for household size.

**Details:** For 2021 tax year only, maximum credit is \$1,052 for an individual - prior and following years maximum credit is \$543. A married couple with 3 or more children could get back as much as \$6,600.

## Advance Child Tax Credit (CTC)

**Eligibility**: Filed a 2019 or 2020 tax return, or enter information into non-filer IRS application, and have a dependent child under the age of 18.

**Details**: For 2021 tax year only, \$3,600 annual credit for a child under age 6; \$3,000 annual credit for a child age 6-17 Monthly payments available for half the value of the credit.

#### Child & Dependent Care Tax Credit

**Eligibility**: Tax filer (available each tax year) paid someone to watch a child or dependent while working or looking for work.

**Details**: For tax year 2021, maximum credit is \$4,000 for one child and \$8,000 for two or more children.

## California State Tax Credits



#### California Earned Income Tax Credit (CalEITC)

**Eligibility**: An adult or person with a qualifying child, who has a valid SSN or ITIN, earned income, files taxes, and has an adjusted income of \$30,000 or less may qualify.

**Details**: CalEITC is a refundable tax credit meant to help low and moderate-income people and families. The maximum credit for an individual is \$243, and a married couple with three or more children could receive \$3,027.

#### Young Child Tax Credit (YCTC)

**Eligibility**: Low and moderate-income working parents of children under the age of 6, who file taxes. Those who qualify for CalEITC likely qualify for YCTC.

**Details**: YCTC is a refundable tax credit meant to help low and moderate income families with young children. Assistance is provided of up to \$1,000 per tax filer.

#### Federal Economic Impact Payments (EIP), known as "Stimulus Checks"



#### **2020 Economic Impact Payments**

**Eligibility**: Filed a 2019 or 2020 tax return, or enter information into a non-filer IRS application, income below certain limits for household size

**Details**: A first payment of up to \$1,200 in April 2020 and a second payment of up to \$600 in December 2020. Most funds have already been administered.

#### 2021 Economic Impact Payments

**Eligibility**: Filed a 2019 or 2020 tax return, or enter information into a non-filer IRS application, income below certain limits for household size. Adult dependents are eligible for a payment in this round only.

**Details**: A third payment of up to \$1,400 in Spring 2021 - most eligible individuals will get their payment automatically and won't need to take additional action.

### California State Stimulus Payments



#### Golden State Stimulus I (GSS I)

**Eligibility**: Filed a 2020 tax return and received the California Earned Income Tax Credit (CalEITC), as well as Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) tax filers with an adjusted income of \$75,000 or less.

**Details**: GSS I provides a one-time payment of \$600 or \$1,200 to low income families and people excluded from federal stimulus funds due to immigration status.

#### Golden State Stimulus II (GSS II)

**Eligibility**: Filed a 2020 tax return and have an adjusted income of \$75,000 or less, and ITIN filers.

**Details**: GSS II provides a one-time payment of \$500 to those who received GSS I and have dependents, \$600 for those who did not receive GSS I with an and additional \$500 for families with dependents, and \$500 (\$1,000 for those with dependents) for ITIN filers.
