


Child Welfare Children and Non-Minor Dependent Youth in Cases




Child Welfare Children and Non-Minor Dependent Out-Of-Home Placements

AB 12: Child Welfare Non-Minor Dependent Youth 18+ in Placement by Placement Type



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





IHSS provides homecare for the elderly and persons with disabilities to support them in their own homes and communities, rather than placing them in more restrictive and expensive institutional care settings.


Annual Percent Difference by Location




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
Ethnicity - Congregate Meals




Ethnicity - Home Delivered Meals

CalWORKs

Two Parent Families	Families with children living in the home with two non-disabled, natural or adoptive parents.
Non-Needy Caretaker	Families with children living in the home whose natural or adoptive parents are ineligible or excluded from receiving assistance.
TANF Timed-Out	Families with children living in the home whose parents are ineligible to receive assistance because an adult head-of-household or spouse of a head-of-household has received federal TANF assistance for total of 48 cumulative months.
Child-Only	Families with children living in home whose parents are ineligible receive assistance.
Total Clients in Welfare to Work	All active CalWORKs adults who have been registered into the Welfare to Work (WTW) program. WTW is the mandatory employment and training program for CalWORKs adults. Clients must register for WTW unless exempted for a condition that prevents them from working. Not all registered WTW clients are actively engaged in the program, as they may be scheduled for activities that have not yet begun, between activities, or non-compliant prior to sanction.
Subsidized Work and Community Experience	Includes public or private sector employment under the close supervision of the activity provider that helps provide basic job skills and can help lead to eventual unsubsidized employment.
Paying Jobs	Includes unsubsidized and subsidized self-employment, public and private sector jobs.
