

### **APS Caseload**






#### **Annual Percent Difference by Location**






## **Ethnicity - Congregate Meals**




## **Ethnicity - Home Delivered Meals**



Total Clients in Welfare to Work	All active CalWORKs adults who have been registered into the Welfare to Work (WTW) program. WTW is the mandatory employment and training program for CalWORKs adults. Clients must register for WTW unless exempted for a condition that prevents them from working. Not all registered WTW clients are actively engaged in the program, as they may be scheduled for activities that have not yet begun, between activities, or non-compliant prior to sanction.
Subsidized Work and Community Experience	Includes public or private sector employment under the close supervision of the activity provider that helps provide basic job skills and can help lead to eventual unsubsidized employment.
